## About 300 people attend art show

More than 300 people attended the 38th annual Neighborhood Art Show Friday, Saturday and Sunday in The Plains, according to show officials.

Sponsored by The Episcopal Churchwomen of Grace Church, the show is traditionally one of the largest in Fauquier County.

This year, the show drew 307 entries in nine adult categories and five categories for youngsters. Of those works offered for sale, 20 were purchased through a silent auction.

Clement E. Conger, the White House curator, judged the adult divisions and Alice Tuckerman Biays, a founding member of the American Academy of Equine Art, judged the children's divisions.

Those who attended the show also voted for their favorite works.
